Old Time Religion

When many of our day think of old-time religion they think in terms of a heartfelt, clapping, feet stomping variety of religion that appeals solely to men's emotions. However, there is a verse in that old song that says: "It was good enough for Paul and Silas and it's good enough for me." It is the old-time religion referred to in this verse to which we refer.

Genuine old-time religion is a belief in the Bible as God's Holy Word. It is a remarkable volume that is all-sufficient and one by which we shall be judged. Old-time religion is a belief in the fact of man's sin and his lost condition. (**Isaiah 64:6; Romans 3:9; I John 1:8**). It is a belief in the virgin birth and divinity of Christ. (**John 20:30-31**). Old-time religion is a belief in the atoning blood (**Revelation 1:5**) and salvation by obedience to the gospel (**Matthew 7:21-23**), with membership in the Lord's church as essential. (**Ephesians 4:2-4**). Old-time religion is a belief in the second coming of Christ, judgment, heaven and hell.

But there are those who complain that such an old-time religion is not sufficient for our sophisticated day. However, one soon learns that by the preaching and practice of this old-time religion that it is powerful to transform lives, inspire men to service and that it helps men to live and to die.

There can be no substitute for old-time religion for it is all-sufficient for all men in life and in death and at the judgment bar of God. Let us return to it!

Time

"To every *thing there is* a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven" (Ecc. 3:1).

There are sixty seconds in a minute, sixty minutes in an hour, twenty-four hours in a day, seven days in a week, and fifty-two weeks in a year. What we do with these precious intervals of time is wholly dependent on our prioritization.

With regard to worry about food, drink, and clothing, Jesus prioritized the kingdom of God and His righteousness (Mt. 6:25-34). With regard to worship, the first day of the week has been prioritized (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:1-2). Proper prioritization of time, a precious resource, is essential to being a good steward. Hence, we must redeem the time which means to use it as wisely as we possibly can (Eph. 5:16). Consider what Jesus accomplished in a brief time with a careful study of the Gospel accounts. He was very aware of time (cf. Jn. 2:4, 7:6-8, 12:23-28, 13:1, 17:1).

There is a time to be born, and a time to die (Ecc. 3:2). Physical death is an appointment we all will keep as long as the heavens and earth remain (Heb. 9:27; Jos. 23:14; Col. 1:16-17). Eventually the physical creation will be burned up at the final day and hour though none of us knows when that will be (2 Pt. 3:10-12; Mt. 24:35-36; Mk. 13:31-33). The realization of this point results in being alert and watchful since salvation is getting closer (Rm. 13:11; cf. Mt. 25). When we pass into eternity let it be said we used our time effectively as servants!
