Judgment and the Flood

In Genesis 6-10 one can read of the incredible story of Noah and the global flood. With this account there are several lessons that can be learned. One of things that should be noted is the judgment of God on mankind. In Genesis 6 the Bible tells us the condition of the world note vs 5 And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. This is an incredibly sad commentary on the people of that day. In fact, in verse 6 God states that he was sorry that he made man or repented that he had made man. When one considers this statement, man is the only thing God created that he was sorry he made. Then in verse 7 God pronounces judgment on the world of that day. The judgment was the word was wicked and the sentence was the destruction of the earth and everything that inhabited it. Thankful Noah was a just man and found grace in the eyes of God.

God had determined to destroy the earth. However, he was going to provide a way of escaping for Noah and his family. God would give Noah the instruction of how to build an ark (Genesis 6:14-17). It is important to note that just because God had given the instructions Noah still had something to do, He had to build the ark. This is exactly what he did, "Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he." (Genesis 6:22) Noah made sure that he and his family was ready to stand before God in judgment. When God set this judgment in action there was no changing it. God opened the fountains of the deep, the windows of heaven and flooded the whole earth. This righteous judgment was for the whole earth.

When one considers the judgment of the days of Noah it is no doubt a serious topic that should be learned from. God had judged the world once with water He will judge the world again and it is vitally important that man is ready for it. One should consider some of likeness of the two judgments. Noah was warned of the judgement was coming. We too have been warned about the coming judgment (Matthew 24:36-37). In the days of Noah there were those who did not believe that the judgment of God was real. Sadly, this is the same thing today (Matthew 24:38-39). In the time of Noah God had given instructions on how to be saved (the ark). God has given us the instructions on what must be done to be saved today entrance into the church (1 Peter 3:30-21).

Now consider one other thing the type of judgment that is given. During the days of Noah God judged the world and thus destroyed it with water. In the last judgment God will destroy the earth with a great fire (2 Peter 3:10). At this same time God will judge the entire earth of all people. Mankind will then be separated, those who have been obedient to God will be rewarded with a heavenly home. Those who were disobedient will be sentenced to an eternity in hell. Knowing this one must ask themselves are they ready to stand before God in judgment. If you find yourself not ready for judgment do what is necessary today be ready.
