## **Just Who Are The Underdogs?**

One term that has become familiar to so many people is the term “underdog.” The word under- dog means, “the one that is losing as in a contest; one that is handicapped, underprivileged, un-favored, etc.” Often, we find use of this word in connection with athletic events. One team may be seen as the underdog while the other team is favored to win. However, it seems that there has been a gross misapplication of these thoughts. Some seem to look upon Christians as the underdogs in life. Such thinking is far from true. The following favors the Christian.

The strength of Christ. Paul noted, “I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me” (Phi. 4:13). We are told, “For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly” (Rom. 5:6). God gave Jesus, “power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him” (John 17:2). Man indeed left to himself is given that Jesus has promised this strength to all who will seek and obey Him.

The power of God. David spoke this truth concerning God, “thou reignest over all; and in thine hand is power and might; and in thine hand it is to make great; and to give strength unto all” (1 Chronicles 29:12). Jesus stated, “with God all things are possible” (Matthew 19:26). The Christian has the promise that “God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:19). God’s power reigns supreme and Christians have that power working for them.

The force of the Word as given through the Spirit. The Bible is the inspired Word of God given through the Holy Spirit, “That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works” (2 Timothy 3:17). “Holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost” (2 Peter 1:21). The Gospel is “the power of God unto salvation” (Romans 1:16). The psalmist noted, “Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path” (Psalm 119:105). The Christian’s desire-withexpectation is firmly implanted in the truth of God’s Word.

Christians may be a minority population wise, but as one can plainly observe from these facts, the Christian is nowhere near being the “underdog” in this life.

## **The Gospel in Five Seconds**

(Taken from House to House Heart to Heart)

The gospel is the good news that Christ died for our sins (1 Corinthians 15:1–5). It is the total message of God’s power to save all who will hear, believe, and obey it (Romans 1:16).

The gospel is contained in the second law God gave. “If the first covenant had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second” (Hebrews 8:7; cf. 8:8–13; 10:9).

The gospel commands a second birth (John 3:3–8). The new birth involves obeying the commands the Spirit has given in the word, including baptism (1 Peter 1:22–23; 1 Corinthians 4:15; James 1:18–22).

The gospel promises a second coming of Christ. He shall appear “the second time” (Hebrews 9:27–28; Mark 13:32; Acts 1:11; 1 Thessalonians 4:14–18).

The gospel warns of a second death (Revelation 20:12–15). The second death involves the disobedient being cast into the lake that burns with fire and brimstone (Revelation 21:8). If we overcome Satan we will not “be hurt of the second death” (Revelation 2:11).

The gospel contains a second law of pardon. God gives a second chance for those who fall (Acts 8:12–24).
