“WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FOR IN A CHURCH?”

Because they have moved into a new community, or maybe they have awakened to the need for religion in their lives, or are unhappy with their “old church,” many people are “looking for a new church home.” What are they looking for? What are we looking for?

1. Some, following family and personal traditions, look for a church like the one they left behind.
2. Because they don't want to travel far to “attend services,” some look for a church nearby.
3. Desiring to feel welcome and wanted, some look for a church with “friendly people.”
4. Some look for a big church, where they can get lost in the crowd. Others look for a small church, where they can quickly get to know everybody.
5. Some look for a church with many “youth activities” and “family things.”
6. Some want a church that is trying to “solve world problems,” committed to social reform and community improvement.

Now, if you will look back over that list, you will notice that nothing is said about seeking a church where they can worship and serve God according to His revealed will. Many people are looking for a church that pleases them, rather than a church that pleases God! If you are interested in finding a church that pleases God, look for the following attributes:

1. A church that respects the sovereignty of God and the authority of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
2. A church that respects the Bible as the inspired Word of God, and the gospel of Christ as the power of God unto salvation.
3. A church that strives to be like the churches of the New Testament—in name, organization, teaching, work, and worship.
4. A church that is concerned about lost souls and eternal destinies.
5. A church that, puts its emphasis on the spiritual needs of man, instead of their social desires

The Lord's Church vows to “speak where the Bible speaks, and to be silent where it is silent.” She strives to follow the instructions of our Lord and the inspired writers in all things. These things should make us happy and strive to present in every assembly. The congregation where we attend should be a beacon that shines in our community.

What Happens When You Get Involved?

There are so many different things you can do for the cause of Christ. Jobs abound for those who are interested. All Christians need to keep in mind what the Bible says about working for the Lord. Paul wrote, “Be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as you know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord” (I Corinthians 15:58). James wrote, “Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves” (James 1:22). And Solomon said, “Whatsoever your hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom in the grave, whither thou goest” (Ecclesiastes 9:10). There are some really good results that occur when one becomes involved in the Lord's work.

Your Attitude Will Be Affected. Paul speaks of “boldness” (Philippians 1:20), “gladness” (v. 18), and “eager expectation” (v. 20). These are three highly desirable qualities, each of which is said to grow out of the viewpoint and course of action that Paul put into effect when he went to work for God and trusted Him for the outcome. How many times have you said, “I wish I had the courage to do...? Can you not see that as you go to work for God, He supplies the courage? Don't you want to be happy? Gladness comes to those who are deeply involved in carrying out the Lord's work. The happiest people I know are those who are diligently serving the Lord in whatever capacity they can. It is also thrilling to live in “eager expectation.” I can't imagine anything much worse than to just accept things as they are with no “eager expectation” of things getting better. Go to work for God, and things will just keep on getting better and better. Christ Will Be Exalted. Paul's driving ambition was to exalt Christ. His greatest fear was to dishonor Christ. You, too, can exalt Christ, if you will do as Paul did and stand for what is right in God's sight. Christ is exalted, and God is glorified when our lights are shining brightly. (Matthew 5:16). The way you conduct the affairs of your life in ordinary circumstances, and the way you act and react during times of trouble, exalt the living God.

You Will Encourage Other Christians. I really get excited when I see fellow Christians getting involved in the Lord's work. I know that they are in for a lot of joy, and I know that the cause of Christ is going to be blessed. It discourages many when, so few are actively involved. But, oh! what a shot-in-the-arm it is when others join in and start doing what they can.

You Will Advance the Cause of Christ. Whatever talents you might possess, when they are put to use for Christ, good things always happen. We are to sow the seed, and God has promised to give the increase. Seed sowing can be done in so many different ways. Always remember that whatever you do as a worker in the Lord's vineyard, it results in seed being sown. You do what you can, and others will do what they can, and together we will see the kingdom of God grow.
