HOW TO STUDY YOUR BIBLE (Part 2)

Always Observe the Verb Tenses

As with any writing, verb tenses are very meaningful because they tell us whether the action is now, continuing, in the future, or already past. About six months before Jesus' crucifixion, He said, "UPON THIS ROCK I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH" (Matthew 16:18). The verb tense shows that the church did not exist at that time, but He would build it at some future time. Unless we very carefully observe the verb tenses, we will misunderstand and misapply what God is saying.

Carefully Observe the Use of Pronouns

The use of pronouns often gives us a deeper insight into what God is saying. For example, by carefully observing the pronouns we learn that Luke joined Paul's company in Troas (Acts 16:6-11) and that he remained in Philippi to work with the newly formed congregation when Paul and Silas departed for Thessalonica (Acts 16:1-17:1).

Pay Attention to "Signal" Words

Watch carefully for such words as but, for, wherefore, and therefore. These words are important as they signal a contrast, an explanation, or a conclusion.

Always Observe the Context

We must never be guilty of taking verses out of their context to prove a conclusion we have already reached, some pet theory we might hold, or even to validate some Scriptural fact or principle taught elsewhere. Always read the verses before and after to get the thought and allow verses to stay in the context. For example, many have taken Paul's statement, "EYE HATH NOT SEEN, NOR EAR HEARD, NEITHER HAVE ENTERED INTO THE HEART OF MAN, THE THINGS WHICH GOD HATH PREPARED FOR THEM THAT LOVE HIM" (1 Corinthians 2:9) to refer to Heaven. Although these statements are true concerning Heaven, applying these words to Heaven represents a gross disregard for the context. By reading the verses before and after, we learn that what Paul is really talking about is the revelation of God's will through inspired men. Always be sure to study statements in their context in order to learn exactly what God is saying.

[Editor's Note] Having a proper understanding helps us to know exactly what God would have us to know. Consider the words of Paul Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. (2 Timothy 2:15). It is so important to study the Bible but also how to study. I pray this article helps you as you study God's word.
