Indifference Will "Close Her Up!"

Someone once said the greatest danger to a congregation comes from indifference. It comes from members who just do not care. It is born from the lack of interest, unconcern, and a desire for neutrality. It is summed up in Revelation 3:16 "So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth."

The devil is seeking to close the doors of the church. And he will use every device at his disposal (Genesis 3:1-6). The enemies of the church have their work made easier when members become indifferent. Zeal is to be a characteristic every child of God (Titus 2:14). The Christian is to "earnestly contend" for the faith (Jude 3). Both of these attributes are exactly the opposite of indifference. Congregations will fail, when her membership becomes indifferent!
