You are the Man

Today we have an expression of speech "You are the Man" when this phrase is used normally it is used in praise of an individual. It can be used to say that someone did something great or is the best at something. However, there is an instance in the Bible where this phrase is used to denote something bad that an individual had done.

In 2 Samuel 11, David commits a horrible sequence of sins. He commits adultery with Bathsheba and then has her husband, Uriah, murdered to cover up the first sin. This chapter closes with the statement "But the thing David had done displeased the Lord" (2 Samuel 11:27). This statement shows us exactly what God thinks of sin. It is displeasing to Him. In fact, the apostle John defines sin as something that is a transgression or a breaking of law, God's Law to be specific (1 John 3:4).

In the next chapter God sends His prophet Nathan to David with a message (2 Samuel 12:1-4). Within the message Nathan tells David about two men in a city one poor and one rich. He told how a traveler came through the city and how the rich man took the only lamb of the poor man and prepared it for a meal for the stranger. David was enraged by this story and said the rich man would surely die and have to repay the poor man for what he took (2 Samuel 12:5-6). Nathan then drops what we might call a bomb shell on David when he says, "You are the man" (2 Samuel 12:7). Nathan wasn't praising David but rather convicting him of his sin.

What Nathan is doing is something that all Christians should do but it isn't always easy. First consider that Nathan was doing what He was commanded by God to do. Second note that Nathan delivered this message as a friend and not as someone looking to say, "Hey I caught you". Nathan's message was from God and was delivered out of love. When one starts to think about something a Christian has to do today is tell others of their sin. Christians have the responsibility to take the gospel into all the world (Mark 16:15-16). When one teaches the Good News of

Christ sin will always to be exposed. The Christian also has the responsibility to go to fellow Christians when they are living in sin and to tell them (Matt 18:15-17). Christians have to make sure that they deliver God's message and that it is done out of love.

Sometimes it's the case that an individual in sin may not realize that they are in sin. Some may not want to admit they are in sin. It took Nathan telling David what he had done for him to realize that he was in sin. In fact, David admitted this very thing (2 Samuel 12:13).

If someone tells you that you that "you are the man" they might just be looking out for your soul. So instead of being angry, rather take a step back and look at the situation.
