The Sin of Lying

It is very important to understand that lying is a sin. Know this is every type of lie as we would classify it i.e., white lie. God considers all lies serious. Consider a few thoughts. The first is found in Revelation 21:8. In a list of sins, some of which we might consider pretty bad (murders, idolaters, unbelieving) all liars are mentioned as having their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone. Note the little word all as man would want to classify lies God does not! A person who would lie to cheat their way out of something is a guilty as the man who lies to his wife about a dress he does not like. One could also examine how God feels about lying when studying the account of Ananias and Sapphira as found in Acts 5. When one considers this passage a lot can be learned. You have this married couple who decides to sell some land (nothing wrong with this) they also decided to give some money to the church (again nothing wrong here). The problem with this account arises when Ananias and Sapphira decide that they are going to lie about the amount of money they sold the land for (Acts 5:1-2). Verse three shows that Ananias had indeed lied verse four shows this is sin, this lie started in his heart. They conceived this idea to lie based on pride. They wanted all to know who they were. They wanted to be like Barnabas who had sold some land and gave the proceeds to the church for those who had need. Imagine for a moment that you are Peter and your rebuking Ananias; you make the charge that he lied to God. Then Ananias drops over dead. This shows the seriousness of lying. God killed Ananias for this sin. In verse 5, the Bible records that great fear came upon all those that were there. Three hours later after God slew Ananias for lying here comes his wife. I can almost picture her entering that room assuming to see her husband, assuming to hear the congratulating remarks for doing a wonderful

work. Instead, it is quiet. Verse 8 shows that she must have asked some questions about her husband because Peter answered her. Peter gives Sapphira a chance to repent, a chance to tell the truth sadly she does not do this. She remains loyal to the lie, and she also dies. These two individuals paid the ultimate price in the fact they died physically with sin in their lives. As was mentioned earlier Revelation 21:8 indicates these two are eternally lost. As the account ends, please take note of Acts 5:11 "And great fear came upon all the church, and upon as many as heard these things." God made Ananias and Sapphira an eternal example on the sin and consequences of lying. I am not making the case that anyone the lies will die physically. However, if left unrepented of, they will die spiritually.
